Will you please reser to your letter of writing to you separately as regards your enquiry Professors Martin and Titterton.

As regards other points raised in your part would prefer that the arranged leak about the expendable pilotless bomber should be made in Australia and that the Australian authorities should be responsible for the arrangements for letting it out. A suggestion to this effect was made in a message from the Chairman of the U.K. Totem Panel to the Chairman of the Australian Totem Panel on the 11th March. Perhaps you would let me know whether the Australian authorities concur in this suggestion.

The U.K. authorities are glad to note the arrangements made by the Australian authorities for keeping a continuous watch on the situation. They would, however, like to be consulted before the pilotless bomber cover-plan is put into operation.

As regards your enquiry about the U.K./
Australian staff for Sir William Penney, communications about the numbers and type of Australian
personnel whom it is hoped will be able to serve on
the joint staff have been exchanged with
Major General Stevens and he has the fullest information available.
